

The 2017 Louisville Division of the Ancient Order of Hibernians (AOH) St. Patrick's Coloring Contest was completed Saturday March 11th through the sustained efforts of AOH and Knights

of Columbus Brothers #10682 Shaun McKiernan, #14604 John O'Doyle & Patrick Ryan, and #15979 Bill Moriarity among many others.

This was the 44rd year for the AOH wax-crayon Coloring Contest for Louisville Archdiocese students. Sixteen 3rd, 2nd, & 1st place and Grand Prize Winners were chosen from over 5,000 Kindergarten through 4th Grade student entries. Six 1st place and Grand Prize International Student Winners were chosen from over 120 entries.

The USA Contest Winners were presented with their original drawing in a 8" x 10" picture frame along with a "Coloring Contest Winner" T-shirt following Saturday March 11th Noon Mass at St Louis Bertrand Catholic Church concelebrated by Archbishop Kurtz and Reverend Edward Gorman, O.P.

The Grand Prize winners also received a \$100 Check.

Later that same day the USA Contest Winners and their Parents, escorted by Brother Bill Moriarity rode in the lead float of the Louisville St Patrick's Parade to an enthusiastic cheering crowds estimated at over 30,000.

"Keep it bright for liberty's sake" is a phrase we use as part of the concluding ceremonies in the Patriotic (4th) degree. It refers to the sword--but does not have anything to do with "show" or light. Keeping a sword bright means polishing and sharpening the sword, so that it will be an immediate and effective tool for defense of the other liberties we treasure: freedom to worship freely, freedom from oppression of any kind, the right to pursue the calling each of us feels we have without the government determining what it wants us to spend our lives doing, freedom to speak without censorship, etc. It is often said that America is the "home of the free" because it is the "land of the brave" and that "freedom isn't free."

The use of the sword in the patriotic degree ceremonies reminds us that many of our brother knights defended the nation when called upon--even to the point of ultimate sacrifice of their lives to protect such freedoms. However, the true "ultimate" goal of all action is cooperation with the grace of God and seeking first His kingdom. The sword is never to be used for

oppression or greed--but for exactly the opposite: defending against such human temptations, both

individually and nationally.

During this season of Lent when we engage in personal sacrifices of fasting and abstinence, prayer and almsgiving, let us also remember in prayer those who have sacrificed in so many ways to give us the freedom to make the little sacrifices for God that we do for the next few weeks. Let us also treasure the sword and "keep it bright for liberty's sake" in our days as they did in theirs: so that each new generation will be blessed with the freedoms we treasure today.

Please get me your activity reports before March 31. Several councils have been great at sending their reports to me. If yours is one of those – Thank You!

In March and April, councils should conduct programs such as 40 Cans for Lent, RCIA involvement, Founder's Day Celebration, Day of Prayer for the Unborn Child, and Fifth Sunday Rosary (Apr. 30th). Councils should be planning for programs to be conducted in May and June. Programs such as Adopt a Highway, Special Olympics, attending the State Convention, and Habitat for Humanity should be planned now.

As I mentioned in the beginning, the deadline for the Program Director and State Deputy Awards almost here. *The deadline for your submissions is March 31st!* You can't earn the award unless you report your activities. Email me a report as soon as possible. Be sure to include any pictures or other details that you find interesting or noteworthy.

I would like to congratulate the following councils on having already earned Program Director status: 390 Louisville, 1004 Morganfield, 6743 Grayson County, 7847 Hopkinsville, 13053 Louisville, 13304 Lagrange, 15979 Louisville, and 16125 Knottsville. I know there are other councils that likely have earned the award, but I am probably



lacking the information to award it, especially in the activity areas. If you believe you have earned this award, please contact me right away. I want every council to earn at the least the Program Director Award.

The Columbian Award (SP-7) can be submitted to Supreme as soon as April 1st. As a reminder, *the newest requirement to* earn the Columbian Award is to report at least four activities from the Building the **Domestic Church program.** There are many opportunities to conduct one of these programs at your parishes in the next month. One way to easily achieve this is to purchase the Building the Domestic Church kiosk from Supreme and putting it in one of your parish churches. More information can be found at http://www.kofc.org/un/en/domestic-church/ parish-programs/cis.html. Take advantage of these opportunities to ensure that you have earned the Columbian Award. If you are on track to earn the Star Council Award, it is extremely important that you schedule these programs now to ensure that you earn the Columbian Award. March Events; March 1, 1781, The Formal ratification of the Articles of Confederation was

announced by Congress. Under the Articles, Congress was the sole governing body of the new American national government, consisting of the 13 original states. The Articles remained in effect through the Revolutionary War until 1789, when the current U.S. Constitution was adopted

March 1943, During World War II in the Pacific, a Japanese convoy was attacked by 137 American bombers as the Battle of Bismarck Sea began. The convoy included eight destroyers and eight transports carrying 7,000 Japanese soldiers heading toward New Guinea. Four destroyers and all eight transports were sunk, resulting in 3,500 Japanese drowned, ending Japanese efforts to send reinforcements to New Guinea.

Birthdays include; American band leader Glenn Miller (1904-1944) was born in Carilinda, Iowa. American soldier and politician Sam Houston (1793-1863) was born in Rockbridge County, Virginia. Telephone inventor Alexander Graham Bell (1847-1922) was born in Edinburgh, Scotland. Italian explorer Amerigo Vespucci (1451-1512) was born in Florence, Italy. He explored South America and the Amazon River, believing he had discovered a new continent. In 1507, a German mapmaker first referred to the lands discovered in the New World as America. James Madison (1751-1836) the 4th U.S. President was born in Port Conway, Virginia.

March 1836, Fort Alamo fell to Mexican troops led by General Santa Anna. The Mexicans had begun the siege of the Texas fort on February 23rd, ending it with the killing of the last defender. "Remember the Alamo" became a rallying cry for Texans who went on to defeat Santa Anna in the Battle of San Jacinto in April.

Next Exemplification: April 22, 2017, All Saints Assembly, Alexandria, KY. The planning is done and the information is on the Kentucky Website. This Exemplification will be held in the Covington Diocese. This will be the last Exemplification for this Fraternal Year.
