#### IN APPRECIATION AND HONOR OF POPE FRANCIS

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Pope Francis was born on December 17th, 1936 in Buenos Aires, Argentina, he was ordained for the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) on December 13th, 1969 during his theological studies at the Theological Faculty of San Miguel; and

**WHEREAS**: **Pope Francis** served as a novice master in San Miguel, where he also taught theology, and later was the Jesuit Provincial for Argentina (1973-1979) and Rector of the Philosophical and Theological Faculty of San Miguel (1980-1986). After completing his doctoral dissertation in Germany, he served as a confessor and spiritual director in Córdoba; and

**WHEREAS**: On May 20th, 1992 he was appointed titular Bishop of Auca and Auxiliary of Buenos Aires, receiving episcopal consecration on June 27th. On June 3rd, 1997 he was made Coadjutor Archbishop of Buenos Aires and succeeded Cardinal Antonio Quarracino on February 28th, 1998. From November, 2005 until November 2011 he served as President of the Bishops' Conference of Argentina; and

**WHEREAS**: On February 21st, 2001 he was created and proclaimed Cardinal by St. John Paul II in the consistory, with the Title of S. Roberto Bellarmino (St. Robert Bellarmine); and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: On March 13th, 2013 Jorge Mario Bergoglio, SJ, was elected Supreme Pontiff on the second day of the Conclave; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: **Pope Francis** has worked tirelessly for the poor, leading by example choosing to live meagerly, leaving the Vatican to meet with the poor and homeless; and

**WHEREAS**: **Pope Francis** has praised the charitable works of the Knights of Columbus and encouraged the organization to defend the sanctity of marriage, the dignity of life, the beauty and truth of human sexuality, and the rights of believers.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Knights of Columbus of Kentucky are grateful to our Lord for bringing Pope Francis to lead Catholics around the world; and

**<u>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</u>**, that the Kentucky Knights of Columbus reaffirm our pledge to support and promote the teachings and ideals of the Catholic Church and fully support Pope Francis.

## **RESOLUTION**

## IN APPRECIATION AND SUPPORT OF THE ARCHBISHOP AND BISHOPS OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Archbishop Kurtz was born on August 18, 1946, in Mahanoy City, Pennsylvania. He earned both the bachelor (1968) and master of divinity (1972) degrees from St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in Philadelphia and a master's degree in social work from the Marywood School of Social Work in Scranton, Pennsylvania in 1976; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Archbishop Kurtz was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Allentown on March 18, 1972 and has served the Archdiocese of Louisville for 13 years; and

**WHEREAS**: He served as an instructor in marriage and family therapy at Mary Immaculate Seminary in Northhampton, Pennsylvania, and as a professor and counselor at St. Pius X Seminary and earned the distinguished title of Monsignor in 1986 and was named Bishop of Knoxville in 1999; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: He has been a strong advocate of the sanctity of Marriage and Life both of which are cornerstones of Columbianism; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: He is a Past President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops where he helped to provide a voice for Catholic beliefs in the public forum; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Archbishop Kurtz has been a charter member of several new councils in the Archdiocese of Louisville and a public supporter of the Order;

<u>WHEREAS</u>: **Bishop Foys** was born on July 27, 1945 in Chicago, Illinois. He began his religious studies for the Diocese of Steubenville at St. John Vianney Seminary in Bloomingdale, Ohio and completed his graduate studies at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. and the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome; and

**WHEREAS**: Bishop Foys was ordained into the priesthood on May 16, 1973 in Holy Name Cathedral of Steubenville, Ohio and served as Diocesan Treasurer, Chairman of the Diocesan Presbyteral Council, and Moderator of the Curia; and

**WHEREAS**: He was appointed Vicar General in 1982 and monsignor in 1987 and taught Canon Law at St. John Vianney Seminary. Pope John Paul II made him a Prelate of Honor in 1986 and a Protonotary Apostolic in 2001 and Bishop of Covington on May 31, 2002; and

**WHEREAS**: The number of priestly vocations in the Covington Diocese has dramatically increased under his tenure as Bishop of Covington; and



<u>WHEREAS</u>: **Bishop Medley** was born September 17, 1952 in Loretto, Kentucky. He graduated at Bellarmine College where he obtained a Bachelor of Arts in philosophy and psychology and earned a Master of Divinity degree from St. Meinrad School of Theology in Indiana; and

**WHEREAS**: Bishop Medley was ordained to the priesthood on May 22, 1982, by Archbishop Thomas C. Kelly, O.P. and served as associate pastor, chaplain, administrator in the Diocese of Louisville, a became director of the Office of Clergy Personnel in 1989, and served as rector of St. Joseph Proto-Cathedral which was elevated to the rank of a basilica; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: He was named pastor of Mother of Good Counsel Church in Louisville in 2005, and of the Transfiguration of Our Lord Parish in Goshen in 2007 with additional duties as a member of the College of Consultors, Priests' Council, Planning Commission, Priests' Health Panel, Priests' Personnel Board and president of the Bardstown/Nelson County Ministerial Association and on the Nelson County Human Rights Commission; and

**WHEREAS**: In December 2009, he was appointed the fourth Bishop of Owensboro by Pope Benedict XVI and his episcopal consecration took place on February 10, 2010, at the Owensboro Sports Center and he selected as his episcopal motto: "Holy Is God's Name."; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: **Bishop Stowe** was born April 15, 1966 in Lorain, OH, and educated at St. Anthony of Padua Parish and Lorain Catholic High School. After a year of community college, Bishop Stowe joined the formation program for the Conventual Franciscan Province of Our Lady of Consolation at St. Bonaventure Friary in St. Louis, MO. During the time of his candidacy he began studies in philosophy and history at St. Louis University and completed a Bachelor of Arts degree in each in 1990. Bishop Stowe earned a Masters of Divinity and a Licentiate in Sacred Theology in the field of Church History from the Jesuit School of Theology at Berkeley; and

**WHEREAS**: In 1995 he was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop A. James Quinn at his home parish of St. Anthony in Lorain. He was assigned to continue at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church as associate pastor in El Paso, Texas. The parish is at the site of the Ysleta Mission, founded in 1682 and the oldest parish in Texas. It is on the U.S.-Mexico border and includes the Ysleta del Sur Pueblo of the Tigua tribe of Native Americans; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: In December, 2002, Bishop Stowe was invited by Bishop Armando X. Ochoa, of El Paso, to serve the Diocese of El Paso as Moderator of the Curia and Vicar General. He later also served as Chancellor of the diocese. With a lack of priests in the diocese, Bishop Stowe also assumed the role of Administrator of Our Lady of the Valley Parish there, while serving in the Chancery. At the Province Chapter of 2010, Bishop Stowe was elected Vicar Provincial of the Province of Our Lady of Consolation; he resigned from the Chancery in El Paso and became Pastor and Rector of the Basilica and National Shrine of Our Lady of Consolation in Carey, OH (Diocese of Toledo). He was re-elected vicar at the Chapter of 2014; and



**WHEREAS**: On March 12, 2015, Pope Francis appointed Conventual Franciscan Father John Stowe as the Third Bishop of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Lexington and he was ordained on May 5, 2015; and

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Knights of Columbus of Kentucky thank the Lord and our Holy Father for sending men of such high caliber and devotion to His church and with genuine care for the His flock; and

**<u>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</u>**, that the Kentucky Knights of Columbus pledge our steadfast support and continued remembrance in our daily prayers for long healthy life and successful ministries for the Most Reverend Joseph E. Kurtz, D.D., the Most Reverend Roger J. Foys, D.D., the Most Reverend William F. Medley, D.D., and the Most Reverend John Stowe, D.D., our beloved Shepherds of the Catholic Church in the State of Kentucky, and the retired Most Reverend J. Kendrick Williams, D.D.

## IN APPRECIATION AND SUPPORT OF SUPREME KNIGHT CARL ANDERSON

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson was born on February 27th, 1951. Mr. Anderson holds degrees in philosophy from Seattle University and in law from the University of Denver. He is a member of the bar of the District of Columbia and is admitted to practice law before the U.S. Supreme Court. Anderson has received honorary doctorates from The Catholic University of America, The Pontifical Theology Academy of Kraków and St. Vincent's Seminary, Latrobe, Pa.; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Supreme Knight Anderson was elected as the thirteenth and current Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus in 2000. Anderson is vice president of the Washington Session of the Pontifical John Paul II Institute for Studies on Marriage and Family; and

**WHEREAS**: He has had a distinguished career as a public servant and educator. From 1983 to 1987, he served in various positions of the Executive Office of the President of the United States, including special assistant to the President and acting director of the White House Office of Public Liaison. Following his service at the White House, Mr. Anderson served for nearly a decade as a member of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights; and

**WHEREAS**: During Mr. Anderson's tenure the Knights of Columbus established the \$1 million Heroes Fund to provide immediate assistance to the families of rescue workers killed in the terrorist attack of Sept. 11, 2001; the \$2 million Pacem in Terris Fund to assist efforts for peace in the Middle East by the Catholic Church; was financial sponsor of the 2004 Papal Concert of Reconciliation; and in conjunction with Project Medishare the Knights of Columbus, through the "Healing Haiti's Children" program, is providing free prosthetic limbs and a minimum of two years of rehabilitation therapy to children in Haiti who lost a limb or limbs as a result of the January 2010 earthquake that devastated that country.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Knights of Columbus of Kentucky thank Supreme Knight Carl Anderson for his leadership and guidance for the past twenty (20) years; and

**<u>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</u>**, that the Kentucky Knights of Columbus pledge our steadfast support and continued loyalty to Supreme Knight Carl Anderson.

# IN HONOR AND IN MEMORY OF FORMER SUPREME KNIGHT VIRGIL C. DECHANT

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Former Supreme Knight Virgil C. Dechant was born September 24, 1930, in Antonino, Ellis County, Kansas, and lived in Leawood, Kansas. He and his wife Ann had four children and 12 grandchildren; and .

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Former Supreme Knight Virgil C. Dechant joined the Knights in 1949 and was a member of LaCrosse (Kansas) Council 2970 and St. Augustine Council 2340 in Liebanthal, Kansas; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Former Supreme Knight Virgil C. Dechant came to the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council Headquarters at New Haven, Connecticut in 1967 to serve as the supreme secretary; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Former Supreme Knight Virgil C. Dechant was the twelfth Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus. He was the Order's longest-serving supreme knight, holding the office from 1977 to 2000; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Former Supreme Knight Virgil C. Dechant As supreme knight, oversaw tremendous growth in the Order's membership as well as in its assets and insurance business, while also opening the Order to greater involvement by the wives and families of its members; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Former Supreme Knight Virgil C. Dechant was instrumental in helping to grow the Knights of Columbus, and fostering the organization's collaboration with the Vatican during the pontificate of Pope St. John Paul II. Dechant "forged a close relationship with the Vatican during the pontificate of St. John Paul II, leading the Order to sponsor numerous renovation projects – including of the façade of St. Peter's Basilica, and working with the pope to promote the faith in Eastern Europe; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Former Supreme Knight Virgil C. Dechant stepped down as Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus on September 30, 2000 at the age of seventy after serving the longest term ever by a Supreme Knight; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Former Supreme Knight Virgil C. Dechant served as the vice president of the Vatican Bank, a Gentleman of His Holiness, and a Councilor on the State Council for Vatican City; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Former Supreme Knight Virgil C. Dechant In recognition of his commitment to the pro-life movement, Dechant received the National Right to Life Award in 1998. He was also the recipient of several Vatican honors, including the Knight Grand Cross of the Order of Pope Pius IX, the Knight Grand Cross of the Order of St. Gregory the Great, and the Knight of the Order of the Holy Sepulcher; and



<u>WHEREAS</u>, the Kentucky Jurisdiction was honored to have Supreme Knight Virgil C. Dechant and his wife Ann in attendance as the Supreme Council Representative at the 91st Kentucky State Convention held in Bowling Green, Kentucky on May 20 - 22, 1994. While at this Kentucky State Meeting, in recognition of his noteworthy accomplishments, contributions to Kentucky society, remarkable deeds, and outstanding service to community, state and nation, he was bestowed a Kentucky Colonel commission by issuance of letters patent; and

#### To Amend Knights of Columbus Kentucky State Council Bylaws Article III Elections-Section2(c)

WHEREAS, The State Officers of the Kentucky Jurisdiction of the Knights of Columbus are charged with prudent use of jurisdiction funds and minimization of costs; and

WHEREAS, The election committee is required to interview sitting state officers along with new candidates annually prior to the State Convention and the Kentucky State Council is obligated to cover the hotel expenses for four district deputies and one past state deputy when the committee meets; and

WHEREAS, A State Officer's actions throughout his term in office will highlight accomplishments or problem areas more effectively than an interview, and

WHEREAS, Due to the possibility that Diocesan Regional Meetings may not be held yearly due to the changing needs of the jurisdiction, the timing of selecting committee members requires more flexibility; and

WHEREAS, According to the Bylaws, The current committee's purpose is to review a candidate's ability and willingness to serve as a state officer; and .

WHEREAS, Convening a committee when there are no new declaration of candidacy submissions does not provide any added value to the election process, but does incur considerable cost; and

BE IT PROPOSED THEN, that a candidate review committee shall be formed only when a declaration of candidacy letter has been submitted for a candidate other than a sitting state officer in accordance with Article III, Section 2 (a) and Since there is already a committee for overseeing the entire election process that is referred to as the "Election Committee" it is prudent to refer to this current Bylaw committee as the "Candidate Review Committee"; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, The Knights of Columbus Kentucky State Council Bylaws Article III Elections-Section 2(c) be amended to say:

"(c) A candidate review committee shall be constituted when a candidate resolution has been submitted for someone who is not currently serving a term as a state officer in accordance with Article III, Section 2 (a). The committee shall consist of a Past State Deputy, other than the Immediate Past State Deputy, to serve as Chairman, plus one District Deputy from each of the four Kentucky Dioceses. A primary and alternate District Deputy from each Diocese will be elected to serve as members of the candidate review committee by the District Deputies in each diocese. The elected primary and



alternate District Deputy must not be a candidate for state office. The alternate will serve only in the absence of the primary member"; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the Kentucky State Council Bylaws Article III Elections-Section 2(d) and 2(e) be amended to have the words "candidate review" replace the word "election" in committee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, The State Officers and Delegates of the 117<sup>th</sup> Annual State Council Meeting in Lexington, Kentucky on May, 16<sup>th</sup>, and 17<sup>th</sup> favorably consider this resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, The Bylaw change becomes considered in force when duly approved by the Supreme Council Board of Directors.

#### Paid for Life Dues

<u>Whereas</u>: It is the policy of the Kentucky State Council that in order to propose the Knights of Columbus have a "Paid for Life" or a Life Membership program, a resolution shall be submitted from a subordinate council; and,

<u>Whereas</u>: The members of Saint Teresa Council #2282, Brandenburg, Kentucky, propose a program where dues are paid up front. A onetime payment be made to the Supreme Council and put into an interest bearing account. This would save monies sent on Dues collections, postage costs and, with the member suspensions; and,

<u>Whereas</u>: Many organizations such as The American Legion and VFW currently have a "Paid for Life" dues program where the American Legion's "Paid for Life" membership is \$480 and the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Life Membership is \$425; and,

Whereas: We propose this would be only offered to an Associate or Insurance members; and,

<u>Whereas</u>: We propose that with an application for life Insurance, an Agent could offer this to a Young Family as an alternative. A young man could have an Annuity and if you are a Knight from the age of 18 to 39 the "Life Membership" would be Supreme Council Per-Capita, State Council Per-Capita, Plus Subordinate Council dues times 25 years; and,

<u>Whereas</u>: We propose this could be offered with either an Annuity or an Application for Life Insurance; and,

<u>Whereas</u>: We propose that if the Supreme Council would take the Paid for Life dues and put it in savings, it could be drawn the yearly for Per-Capita each year, where both the State Council and the Subordinate Council would be credited once a year.

**<u>Be it resolved</u>**, that Saint Teresa Council 2282, is proud to recommend that a Paid for Life Dues Program be considered as a Knights of Columbus order-wide plan; and,

**Be it further resolved**, that the State Officers and Delegates of the 117<sup>th</sup> Annual Kentucky State Council Meeting in Lexington, KY on May 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020 favorably consider this Resolution.

# Knights of Columbus Resolution for State Council

Whereas: Article 1 of the Kentucky State Council By-Laws currently does not set what members of the State of Kentucky shall attend the Supreme Convention as Delegates; and

Whereas: That the By Laws should be amended to name what individuals of the State Council and what members of the general state membership be allowed to be part of those named to be delegates sent to the Supreme Convention; and

Whereas: That the Supreme Charter states that the State Deputy and Immediate Past State Deputy are required members to the Supreme Convention and that the additional non-required members be chosen in the following manner. That if the number of non-required members be an even number then 50% of the delegates come from the State Council and that the other 50% of the members come from the general membership of the State Convention. If the number of non-required members be an odd number then 49% of the delegates come from the State Council and 51% of the members come from the general members of the State Convention; and Whereas: The non-required delegates coming from State Council current

members of the state council and be appointed by the current State Deputy; and

Whereas: The non-required delegates coming from the general membership be defined as voting members attending the convention (excluding state officers) in good standing and District Deputies attending the convention; and **Whereas:** These delegates be chosen by a lottery of those that have an understanding of the requirements and have placed their names into a lottery drawing on the first day of the convention; and

Whereas: We Believe that if members of the general state membership where allowed to attend the Supreme Convention along with the State Officers this would allow the general membership of the state a better understanding of the workings of both the State and Supreme councils; and

Therefore be it resolved; Article 1 be amended to add the following: That each year at the state convention on the first day of business that nonrequired delegates be divided into two groups. Group one being the members of the State Council and are appointed by the State Deputy which will be named on a date before the supreme convention. Group two being those coming from the general membership as defined above. Those in this group be given the opportunity to place their names in a pot for the opportunity to attend the Supreme Convention as a member of the State of Kentucky Delegation. That those members placing their name in the pot understand and agree that they will make themselves available on the dates of the Supreme Convention and any meetings needed before the convention in preparation of said convention. That their expenses for travel, lodging, and meals be reimbursed by the Supreme Council based on the per diem formula used by the Supreme Council which may or may not cover all expenses incurred by the attendees as members of the Kentucky Delegation. That on the Second (or last day) of the State Convention a short period be set aside to allow additional general members, as defined above, to enter their names into the drawing. Then the general member delegates be drawn from

all names submitted, that this drawing be conducted by the state council and that those members drawn will agree to make themselves available for any meetings needed before the convention in preparation for the event and agree to be available for the Supreme Convention. Also two additional names will be drawn as alternates in case unforeseen events prevent one or more of the general delegates are unable to attend.

## Fiscal Responsibility Resolution

Whereas, The Supreme Directors hold a clear Fiduciary Responsibility to the Membership and Policy Holders and;

Whereas, Concerns have been raised about the cost of extensive travel, legal costs and possible conflicts of interest and;

Whereas, Current reporting mechanisms fail to give an easy to understand itemized reporting of it;

**Resolved,** Within 90 days of the conclusion of the Supreme Council an audited report be available on an unrestricted section of the K of C website to include specific detail information of the following:

- 1. Annual Salary and Stipend of each Supreme Director
- 2. Annual Travel costs including transportation, meals, lodging and per diem, categorized for each Supreme Director for each trip taken including identification of location.
- 3. Any fees, bonus, equipment , products, memberships or other reimbursement received by Supreme Directors
- Cost by category of all lawsuit settlements and judgments including legal fees, consultants, travel and preparation. (categorized instead of individual to protect nondisclosure agreements)

The report will include the last 3 Columbian years and will be automatically reported to the Supreme Council in writing no less than 30 days prior to the meeting and be it further;

**Resolved,** All Supreme Directors will report any relationship with companies and independent contractors that do business with the Knights of Columbus, or its subsidiaries; including positions, property, rental, equipment, product usage or family members, and report this within 90 days of the close of the Supreme Convention to be automatically reported to the Supreme Council in writing no less than 30 days prior to the meeting and be it further;

**Resolved,** All Supreme Directors will report all family members with titles, employed or contracted by the Knights of Columbus since taking their position and be it further;

**Resolved,** That upon passage in this body the Resolution will be transmitted for inclusion in the State Convention for transmission to the Supreme Council for consideration and sent to all surrounding Councils, Assemblies, Chapters, Districts and Conferences for consideration for adoption and transmission.
