## In your Council...

Pray for the needs of your brother Knights, parish and the world.

- Step 1. Recruit and recognize at least two "Men of the Hour" from within your Council to carry out this specialized ministry of prayer throughout your fraternal year.
- **Step 2.** Gather prayers and petitions during your monthly council meeting along with any prayer requests from the parish that your pastor may pass along.
- Step 3. Take the organized prayer requests directly to Christ in a special weekly/monthly Holy Hour and ask our Lord for his intercession and assistance for those in need.
- **Step 4.** Notify those you are praying for that you are asking Christ to help them in their times of need, and that you will continue to do so until their difficulty passes.



### In your Assembly...

Pray for the needs of active military service personnel and their families, veterans, and community first responders.

- **Step 1.** Recruit and recognize at least two "Men of the Hour" from within each Council of your Assembly to carry out this ministry of prayer throughout your fraternal year.
- Step 2. Have the Sir Knights seek out the names and needs of active military service personnel (and families), veterans, and community first responders in need of prayers.
- Step 3. Take the organized prayer requests directly to Christ in a special weekly/monthly Holy Hour and ask our Lord for his intercession and assistance for those in need.
- **Step 4.** Notify those you are praying for that you are asking Christ to help them in their times of need and that you will continue to do so until their difficulty passes.

## A well prepared Holy Hour will help you be at your best for an audience with our Lord!

As Men of the Hour, you are called to regularly enter into an audience with Jesus Christ and carry with you the needs and prayers of many. So how will you prepare for your time with him? Shooting from the hip haphazardly definitely isn't the right approach. Get yourself prepared, have a plan, and get into the proper frame of mind for your time with Jesus,

#### Do your prep work beforehand.

Make sure you clearly write down your petitions for our Lord and review them carefully before you present them to him. We recommend you provide your Pastor with a copy of the petitions so he can help you with your prayers and is also fully aware of the needs of his flock.

### Follow a structured flow of activity for your Holy Hour and start with humility!

How do you feel when somebody comes running up to you and asks you for something without even saying hello or how are you? Irritated possibly? That's often what we do when we speak to our Lord. Too frequently we run toward him as though we are double parked and forget to say "Lord I am unworthy and you are ever perfect. I am truly grateful for all you have done and continue to do for me and others. I humbly ask you to help those whose name and needs I present to you now. Through your grace please hear the petitions I present today and help make me a reflection and instrument of your love and peace."

#### Don't rush, it's not a race.

Cherish each moment you spend with our Lord. Even if you finish your prayer requests quickly take the remaining time to meditate on your love for Christ. Take time to reflect on the comfort only he can give the world. And finally, always remember to say thank you for listening and for the grace and love he provides to us all each and every day.
