CHALLENGES FOR FRATERNAL OPERATIONS

- Pandemic continues
 - Second wave building, uncertain future
 - New norms for life with the virus
- Economic turmoil growing
 - Massive unemployment, companies shut down
- Social unrest spreading
 - Demonstrations, riots, national focus
- Political Divisiveness worsening
 - No middle ground

1. EMBRACE DIGITAL METHODS

- See posted webinar on digital tools and methods
- Appoint a technology director
- Help members become comfortable with use
- Make permanent part of council ops



2. LNNB: Contact and engage members

- Contact every member
 - Don't just send an email
 - Assist with basic needs
- Engage members with service activities



2. LNNB: Knights Helping Knights

- Help financially struggling members
- Create job banks: Help wanted / available
- Encourage hiring a brother Knight
- Host job hunter networking meetings



3. New normal for life with pandemic

- Still taking shape
- Different in every state and city
- Common theme: Protect the vulnerable



3. New normal: suggestions for relaxed restrictions

- Follow civil, religious, county health regulations
- Avoid unnecessary travel
- Take special measures to protect the vulnerable
 - members, volunteers, guests



3. New normal: suggestions for meetings, events

- Offer a digital option to participate without risk for health
 - Combine digital with face to face
- Use entry controls to turn away sick or exposed
 - Take temperatures, ask questions
- Use hand sanitizers and disinfectants
- Take special precautions
 - Masks, spacing, group size, avoid touching



3. New normal: suggestions for meetings, events

- Sanitize food prep and serving areas
- No self serve food or drink
- Plate the food in clean area and bring to guests
- Use individually packaged condiments
- Don't use cash transactions
- Offer take out meals



4. HELP REOPEN THE CHURCHES

- Happening right now
- Pastors need KofC help
- Excellent opportunity to engage members immediately
- Excellent opportunity to recruit new members
- Great way to start new fraternal year

 - Use council meeting tools
 - Modify existing script as needed



AWARDS

New Criteria for 2020 - 2021



McGivney Award

- 5% Net Growth in Membership
 - Reduced from 7%
- Minimum 3 20
 - Reduced from Minimum 4 35



FOUNDERS AWARD

- Host and promote two Fraternal Benefit Seminars
 - Removed Quota of 2.5% and Min 3 / Max 18
 - Seminar must be promoted
 - No attendee minimum.
 - Can do combined seminars with other councils
 - Use approved presentations
 - General Agent reports completion to Supreme



COLUMBIAN AWARD

- 16 Program Credits
 - 4 each in Faith, Family, Community and Life Categories
- Removed Required Programs
- Added More Featured Programs



STAR COUNCIL AWARD

- McGivney Award (Membership)
- Founders Award (Insurance)
- Columbian Award (Programs)
- Submit Forms #365 and #1728
- Safe Environment Compliant (US / CAN)
- Removed requirement to be current with Supreme Assessments



STAR DISTRICT AWARD

- Membership Goal (70% of combined council quotas)
- Insurance Goal (All councils fully comply)
- At least one council in District must earn Star Council
- Submit all required Form 944 reports on Council Status
