

#### 2021 Salute to Summer Games

The 2021 Salute to Summer Games is underway! 


### New stained glass window of Blessed Fr. McGivney




### **Help with New Marian Shine**

And while a \$1,000 deductible for a parish with 400 families isn't a big problem, for a parish with 40 families it is a huge issue. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to remove that burden for two small parishes. Thanks again.

Convention planning is in full swing. We will be having a one day, hybrid model convention this year. Delegates have the option of attending live or virtually. Saturday morning we will have a session in which we use our state council Zoom account to cover items such as my address, KAPID, and various other programs. We will break for lunch, and then go into a GoTo Webinar session, supported by Supreme Council staff. We will do officer elections, resolutions, and new business during this session. A software called Election Buddy will be used by all delegates for voting, whether they are in person or attending virtually. # History Report State Historian Billy Hancock PSD



One Hundred Thirty-Nine years ago the Knights of Columbus chartered in New Haven, Connecticut. Since then, only fourteen Knights have held the title Supreme Knight. Patrick Kelly became number fourteen when he was elected by the Board of Directors to replace Carl Anderson. Follows is the list of the fourteen with their years of tenure:
