



MINUTES OF THE SUPREME CONVENTION

The 139th "Virtual" Supreme Convention Highlights

Dates: August 3rd and 4th, 2021

The 2021 Supreme Convention was held "Virtually" from St Mary's Catholic Church and the Supreme offices in New Haven, CT. The delegates of the KY Jurisdiction gathered at the Embassy Suites Hotel in Lexington, KY for the two-day event.

State Chaplain Fr. John List was unable to attend.

The opening mass was held at 6:30pm Tuesday August 3rd from St. Mary's Catholic Church New Haven, CT. While our State Chaplin was unable to con-celebrate mass at the hotel, the delegates were able to receive communion. Special thanks to Fr. Linh Nyguen for providing the consecrated host. The mass was followed by an address from Supreme Knight Patrick Kelley. Supreme Advocate John Marella read the proposed Resolutions and the substitute resolutions created for the purpose of combining similar resolution as presented by the various jurisdictions.

- Resolutions 389 & 390 addressing council meetings and changes to sections 124 & 125 have been amended to reflect revised council agendas.
- Resolution 391 continued to address the term "meeting" and the sections affected by the changes.
- There were 386 resolutions submitted by the State Councils and 15 resolutions submitted by the Supreme Council.

Report of the Audit Committee – Michael Wills

- As of the end of the FY 12/31/2020 the third-party auditors reported a clean audit. The impact of the Pandemic this past fiscal year has been significant. 82% of our assets are in bonds. There was a \$50 million negative impact this past year over FY 2019.
- The Order's Assets & Reserves are at least equal to or greater to what is required by Federal regulations to ensure that the Order can meet its financial obligations
- The biggest risk to the future earnings of the Order continues to be the low interest rate environment.

AFTER THE EXEMPLIFICATION

Below is a message that District Deputy Joe Carter delivers to new knights directly after the Charity, Unity, Fraternity Exemplification. DD Joe does a great job of connecting our exemplification to the roots of Knighthood.

The ceremony you have completed appears to be a contemporary creation. However, the concept of an organization interested, in faith, charity, and brotherhood extends back to the early Middle Ages and Medieval Period. The three steps to knighthood are also a part of that period.

The term "Knight" has Germanic and Dutch roots. It is related to the Dutch German word "Knecht" (nay-chik). It is a term meaning "Servant." Servants to their God, their king and their community.

To become a knight, young boys from noble families were offered the privilege of becoming Pages. They received lessons in reading, writing, arithmetic as well as religion. After a period (years in most cases) during a religious ceremony, a Page would be formally promoted to a Squire. The Squire was not only a warrior in training, but he also received training in court etiquette, the code of chivalry and heraldry (protocol). After a time, Squires that were worthy would be recommended for promotion to Knighthood, and a



sponsor presented him to the king for knighting. During the knighting ceremony, the candidate swore he would be devoted to the Church, to defend the week, to

show generosity to the poor, and to always speak the truth. Breaking this oath was a crime against God, the King and any other knight. Knighthood was not a title; it was a way to live life.

Clearly, the concept of three degrees to knighthood is not new. What is new is the current speed of communications, and the instant access to information. As a result, years of apprenticeship is no longer required. What has not changed, however, is that we are still obligated to defend the faith and show charity to the needy. Knighthood continues to be a way to live your life.

With completion of the knighting ceremony, men can hold leadership positions as well as become a candidate for the fourth degree.

Every citizen must try to understand and appreciate his country's ideals. The fourth Degree Program and becoming a Sir Knight affords you the opportunity to become more knowledgeable of your country's promises and allows you to take part in the preservation and the perpetuation of our freedoms.

The afternoon of Friday the 13th was, contrary to popular superstition, quite fortuitous (at least for this month). First off, it marked the inaugural feast day of Blessed Michael McGivney. Secondly, a State Chaplains' meeting offered some thoughts by our supreme chaplain, Archbishop William Lori, and Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly, along with an opportunity for questions from local chaplains.

One observation that stood out for me was that a review of council reports nationwide indicated that 50% of councils lacked a chaplain! I'm not sure how true that is of the councils in Kentucky, but Archbishop Lori did not miss the opportunity to give myself and the other state chaplains a substantive challenge: find out which councils suffer this deficit and reach out to pastors (of sponsoring parishes) to invite them to connect with their local council. A promise was made to send out to state chaplains a list of such councils in their state, so I'll be looking for that in the mail.

Another observation (if I recall correctly, from the Supreme Knight) was the encouragement for councils to focus their recruitment efforts on young husbands and fathers in the parish. The logic went something like this: if we recruit primarily seniors, we are limiting new members' time of service. Or, to put it more bluntly, the younger the new members, the more vital the council. Mention was made of the "Into the Breach" recruitment videos and their appeal to young men looking for a greater purpose in life. I encourage every council to view those videos and find ways to utilize them in your recruitment efforts? (Pssst, have you scheduled a recruitment Sunday with your pastor yet?)

Last year I said I hoped I had "attended" my only online virtual Supreme Convention. Didn't work out that way. So this year I'll say I hope I just attended my last virtual convention. Next year it'll be held in Nashville, and I highly recommend that you try to be there, especially for the opening Mass.

At the Memorial Mass Necrology we commemorated the passing of our State Chaplain Fr. Mario Tizziani, Past State Deputies Gary Berkemeier and Gerald Roof, and Former District Deputies Donald Korte and Camille Picciano. Good Catholic Gentleman who we lost during the last Fraternal Year. May they rest in peace and may perpetual light shine upon them.

Star Councils!

I haven't seen the list yet, but congratulations to the Councils that achieved Star Council status and other awards this year. A real accomplishment during the pandemic!

Council Forms

- Form 185, the Report of Officers Chosen for the Term, was due 6/30. As of 8/19, Supreme reports that 23 Councils have not submitted this Form. This is important so that new Grand Knights requiring SET qualifications can be notified and other Officers can get important information and training
- Form 365, the Service Program Personnel Report was due 8/1. As of 8/19 Supreme reports
 that 44 councils have not yet submitted this form. This is important so that new Program,
 Youth, and Family Chairmen requiring SET qualifications can be notified and other
 Chairmen can get important information and training.

BURNS CONT.

- 22 Councils have not submitted either their Form 185 or Form 365. They should not be holding any KofC sponsored activity with youth interactions.
- Form 1295, the Semiannual Council Audit Report, is due 8/15. As of 8/19 Supreme Reports
 that 29 councils have not submitted this form. Of those 29, 20 are two or more audits
 behind, and 2 of those are more than 3 years behind. Councils who miss consecutive audits
 are subject to having the \$5K bond that Supreme provides for Treasurers and Financial
 Secretaries revoked.

SET Compliance

The GK, Program Director, Community Director, and Family Director of each council are required to take KofC provided Safe Environment Training. Those people will be getting notification from Supreme shortly and will get 30 days to complete the training.

Recruit! and Retain!

19 councils have initiated new Brother Knights so far this year, **and earned a \$25 incentive** from the state for each new member!

Feel free to ask your District Deputy, the State Officers, or our Regional Growth Director for assistance in recruiting!

If each Knight asks 4 men a year to join the Order, and only one of them says yes, you'll still double the size of your council. If you don't ask, you don't grow. Be sure to use the new eMembership as a tool to get men to take the first step toward full membership.
