STATE CHAPLAIN FR. JOHN LIST

“I have called you by name.”

Our world is hurting- scandal, division, disease, doubt. We all need healing, yet many of us are separated from the very source of our strength. In the midst of these turbulent times, Jesus is present, reminding us that he is more powerful than the storms of life. He desires to heal, renew, and unify the Church and the world. In answer to that call the bishops of the United States have initiated the National Eucharistic Revival, a three-year campaign to unite us once again around the source and summit of our faith, the Holy Eucharist. I encourage you to check out the website, <https://eucharisticrevival.org/> and to join me in signing up for updates and inspirational messages. Some parishes, like my own, will be having a Eucharistic procession this Sunday for the first time in a looooong time. But that is just the beginning of what we hope will be a joyful, expectant grassroots response of the entire Catholic Church in the U.S. to this divine invitation.

One cloud on the horizon that may very well become a storm requiring a strong response from the people of God is the highly anticipated decision from the U.S. Supreme Court in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women’s health Organization*. If, as seems likely, the decision in that case effectively overturns the disastrous precedent set by *Roe v. Wade*, it will not mean that the constitutional right to life is guaranteed to life in the womb, as taught by the Church. However, it will mean that regulation of abortion is returned to the states, and Kentucky has already passed laws to go into effect should the decision be handed down as expected. It will mean that many women will face the prospect of difficult pregnancies and will look to the Church for support. We must be ready to back up our values with whatever resources we can muster.

Throughout the years, the Church in the U.S. has developed many ministries to serve expectant mothers for whom a pregnancy is a difficulty as well as those who find it a challenge to care for their children after they are born. Over 150,000 low-income women deliver their babies at Catholic hospitals each year. Catholic Charities offices in each of the dioceses of Kentucky offer social services to women and children in need. Another rapidly growing initiative of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops is “Walking with Moms in Need”, a parish-based to help parishioners identify local resources to fill in the gaps so that pregnant and parenting women receive the material, spiritual and emotional support they need.” This program is being kicked off in the Diocese of Lexington on Monday, June 20, with a Zoom conference sponsored by our office for Peace and Justice. In addition, my parish is collecting change in baby bottles to support our local pregnancy support center, Haven Care Center in Danville. I encourage you to contact your diocese and/or your local pregnancy support center to see what efforts you can support. One battle may be coming to an end, but a new call to faithfulness follows.

Here are items that should be on all Councils and District Deputies checklist to consider/complete for June and July.

- The Report of Officers Chosen (#185) is due by June 30th. This can be easily completed by the Financial Secretary in the Member Management software or can still be filled out and sent in. Please make sure a copy is sent to the State Deputy and your District Deputy.
- RSVP Applications (Supreme Form #2871) for \$100 refunds for Councils giving at least \$500 in support of a seminarian or novice are due at Supreme between April 1st and Jun 30th.
- After the upcoming Elections, Council Officer information needs to be sent to the KY State Secretary for the State's records. Any changes to Council meeting location or time also should be sent to the State Secretary.
- Prepare the Councils Columbian Award Application (#SP-7) and have the State Program Director Review before sending a final copy to the Supreme Council office before the June 30 deadline. Your State Program Director is a great resource to help with this report. This document is also a great tool for future Council Officers to be able to review all the activities done by the Council (large or small) to help with their Goals and Calendar for upcoming Fraternal Years to come.

The following article is an extract from the Diocese of Covington Messenger dated January 7, 2005. It highlights some of the pro-life activities of the Covington Diocese Pro-Life Commission and the Knights of Columbus.

Knights of Columbus – Champions of the pro-life movement

The Knights of Columbus is a strong, well-funded, politically astute, distinctively Catholic family organization. The following is but a partial list of their pro-life initiatives.

- Active defense of the constitutionality of the Partial Birth Abortion Ban Act, which faces a stiff challenge in Federal Courts.

- Support and funding of an *amicus curiae* brief in the cases leading to a Supreme Court decision that there is no constitutional right to have oneself killed.

- Annual presence at the March for Life in Washington, D.C., where thousands of Knights carry placards and banners. They also provide financial support for the March's national poster and essay contest for young people.

- Funding for many projects of our Diocesan Pro-Life Commission. The local Knights are the largest single contributor to the March for Life, enabling hundreds of students to participate. They provide awards for a diocesan eighth-grade essay contest and they have donated \$500 for a new high

school essay contest.

- Construction of a Memorial to Unborn Children in St. Mary's Cemetery, Ft. Mitchell, by local Knights. Since 1992 more than 2,000 such memorials have been erected in the United States, Canada, the Philippines, Mexico, Guatemala, and elsewhere.

- Sponsorship of the North American campus of the John Paul II Institute for Studies on Marriage and Family in Washington, D.C., the only international pontifical graduate school of theology


dedicated to the study of marriage and family.

- Nearly \$15 million in grants and services to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops since 1984, to support their pro-life office and the Diocesan Development Program for Natural Family Planning.

- Many other pro-life grants, such as those supporting Priests for Life, Campaign for the Family, Morality in Media's National Obscenity Law Center, Birthright, and Life Athletes.
