



STATE SECRETARY LUKE WILLIAMS

KY State Billing News – At the most recent State Organizational Meeting I made a presentation about the State Per Billing procedures. Here is a snippet of that presentation.

There is currently only one "Bill" that the KY State Secretary sends out to Councils for payment. The State Per Capita Billing is sent out before February 10th of every year, and it is based on the Council's membership roster as of January 1st. At the 2022 KY State Convention, a resolution was presented and passed by the delegates to lower the per capita bill to \$6.50 per Associate & Insurance member. There were no changes to the \$2.50 per Honorary Member, or "no charge" to Inactive, Disabled, Honorary Life (Priests are Honorary Life members) or Permanent Deacons. There are only two special exemptions from the annual per capita billing.

1) New Councils are exempted from the State Per Capita Billing-This is effective for their first year only.

2) Per KY State Council bylaws... "Such per capita assessment when levied shall continue in force and effect unless and until reduced or increased by action of the State Council".

The State Per Capita Bill is emailed to both the Council Grand Knight and the Financial Secretary. Checks are to be made out to "Kentucky State Council" and mailed with the completed bottom 1/3 of the bill to: Kentucky State Council c/o Luke A. Williams, State Secretary 33 Oriole Lane Campbellsville, KY 42718-9652

Note for some you scratching your head saying we used to get more bills than that every year...Previously, the State Council charged a twice a year "New Member" fee to councils to cover expenses incurred with Exemplifications (1st/2nd/3rd Degree) but since the new Charity, Unity & Fraternity exemplification, those previous expenses have gone away. On a side note, The Supreme Council also sends each council a per capita billing twice a year that includes a per member amount due as well as charges for Catholic Advertising and Culture of Life.

What's Happening this Month

Here are items that should be on all Councils and District Deputies checklist to consider and/or complete for August and September.

- The Semiannual Council Audit (#1295) is due August 15.
- Continue with the planning of a Fall Church Drive using the kit from the Officers Online.
- Continue with the planning of an upcoming Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest the kit from the Officers Online/supplies online app.
- Our Founder, Fr. Michael McGivney's feast day on August 13, 2022, and it is cause of celebration for the Order. Check out the resources at https://www.kofc.org/en/events/father-mcgivney-beatification/toolkit.html?1tab=1tab0 to help your parish/council celebrate Father McGivney's feast day and promote his legacy.
- Start planning for upcoming Soccer or Hocky Programs and order a kit using the Officers Online, then select the supplies online app and select kit using the Fraternal icon.
- Start planning a Coats for Kids Drive.



The Fraternal Programs Report (10784) form will allow reporting for most Supreme-recommended programs. This new form replaced 24 individual report forms, streamlining the number of forms council officers are expected to use. The electronic 10784 form is available by clicking here.

RECOMMENDED BEST PRACTICES:

- Submit one report form per program.
- This new form is optional for any reporting on Featured Programs, Free Throw Championship, Soccer Challenge, Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest, or the Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest, each of which has its report forms that are required to be submitted.

- Save copies of all report forms to assist with the completion of the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity (#1728) and the Columbian Award Application (#SP-7).
- Use your Fraternal Leader Success Planner (#5033) to help document the number of programs, events, charitable hours, and distributions throughout the year.
- When calculating service hours, remember that family members and volunteers assisting the Knights can be counted towards your totals.
- Reporting should be done in whole numbers only do not report fractions of hours or spare change.

Sir Knights -

During the Organizational Meeting held in Georgetown last month, I gave a summary of the growth of the Fourth Degree over the past four years that I would like to share with you. In the last fraternal year (2021-2022), Kentucky achieved 85% of our recruiting goal of 165 new Sir Knights or 141 new members. In spite of another good year of recruiting, the total number of Sir Knights in Kentucky decreased by 4! I attribute the decrease to a combination of deaths and the Affiliate Membership program that took many Sir Knights out of the Fourth Degree. It goes to show that we need to continue to recruit new members into the Order and then into the Fourth Degree. A large portion of these newly recruited Sir Knights just joined the Order within the last two years.

Previous years were up and down with our best year being 2020-2021 where the Fourth Degree in Kentucky grew by 120 members. Overall, the Fourth Degree grew by 156 members or 7.1% from July 1, 2018 from 2193 to 2349. The growth of the Fourth Degree was only made possible by the Sir Knights from your Assembly. I thank you for your support in growing the Fourth Degree during this time.

This should be the last Newsletter article for me as the Kentucky District Master of the Fourth Degree. I have had the honor of conferring the honors of the Fourth Degree on more than 500 new Sir Knights, forming two new Assemblies, installing many Assembly Officers, and getting to know many of you as we have promoted active Catholic citizenship and fostered the spirit of patriotism. Special highlights for me during this time include Knighting my son Curtis Paul and my Brother Matt into the Fourth Degree as well as Bishop Stowe. I will treasure thee memories.

I would like to especially thank the Kentucky Degree team formally for their support over the past four years. I can say without reservation that we have one of the best Fourth Degree Teams in the Order! Thank you!

And as always, remember, in order to grow the Fourth Degree, we must first grow in the First, Second, and Third Degrees. Recruit new members into your council and advance them through the higher degrees so that they can become Sir Knights in the Fourth Degree. Our councils, parishes, and communities need us Sir Knights more than ever. Let's build up our Army of Knights to fight for what is right and just.
