GRILLING FOR MIRACLE LEAGUE

Mary Queen of the Holy Rosary Council #14372 in Lexington grilled hamburger and hotdogs for the families participating in Miracle League Baseball on April 30th.

For those who don't know, Miracle League "removes the barriers that keep children with mental and physical disabilities off the baseball field and lets them experience the joy of America's favorite pastime. Since the main barriers for these adults arise from the natural grass fields used in conventional leagues, Miracle League teams play on a custom-designed, rubberized turf field that accommodates wheelchairs and other assertive devices while helping to prevent injuries."

ULTRASOUND FOR HAVEN CARE

Council #6317, Danville – Sts. Peter & Paul parish presented their local pregnancy care center, Haven Care, with a check for \$32,000. The director of Haven Care was able to purchase a new 3D ultrasound machine with the \$16,000 raised by the Fr. Thomas Malloy Council and the matching funds from Supreme's Ultrasound initiative.

The efforts started in July of 2022 as part of the "ASAP" program. During the vetting process and obtaining the necessary information to qualify, the director of Haven Care communicated the need for a new ultrasound since the model they had was older and expensive to maintain. Additionally, the ability to have higher quality 3D imaging better assists the mother's decision to choose "life". Brother Bob Rennier ran down all the necessary information to file the paperwork by August, and then the massive fundraising effort went into action. The pastor (Fr. Anthony, McLaughlin) and the Knights of 6317 began to appeal to their parish as well as those in surrounding counties, all of whom are served by Haven Care. The fundraising (led by Brother Jerry



Lunney) accomplished their target of \$16,000 by December and then requested the matching funds from Supreme. Contributions, large or small, quickly put this project into

motion with great momentum. The exceptional work and coordination completed the process of providing Haven Care with their ultrasound options allowing the acquisition and placement to occur by this past February. Amazing!

Council 6317 raised the funds through coordination with parishes in Boyle, Garrard, Lincoln, and Mercer counties, Amen Corner of Sts. Peter and Paul, and St. Andrew's Council in Harrodsburg all served by Haven Care.

MAKE IT SPECIAL

St. Paul told the early Christians to make themselves special. By doing so, they encouraged others to join them in the Christian faith. My question is, What are you doing to make the Knights of Columbus special?

In June you will have elections of officers. This should be followed by an installation of officers ceremony. The ceremony is conducted by your District Deputy. Members and their wives and families

After the ceremony there should be a celebration with food and drink depending on what your council can afford. If you can have it after a Sunday Mass meet for breakfast. You can combine this with a corporate communion if you feel you can get more members to attend with such a designation. But, whatever you do make this an important occasion. Making becoming an officer important in front of the whole community just might encourage others to run for office. You might find you have more than one person running for office. You might find that you do not have the same men in the same office for years and years as is often the case in too many councils.

STATE CHAPLAIN FR. JOHN LIST

"Behold, God's dwelling is with the human race!" Revelation 21:3

As we continue in the unfolding of the Easter season, we have the opportunity to reflect more deeply on the meaning of the Paschal mystery. The document of the US bishops on The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church has this to say: "The salvation offered in the Life, Death, and Resurrection of Christ is nothing less than sharing in the very life of God, in the communion of love among the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. There is no greater gift that God could possibly give us. In Christ, we are sharers in the divine nature (2 Pt 1:4). The Church Fathers referred to this participation in the divine life as 'divinization.' The eternal Son of God made this possible by becoming man and uniting humanity to his divine Person. St. Augustine explained, 'the maker of man was made man, so that man might be a receiver of God.' In fact, Pope Francis reminds us that 'in the bread of the Eucharist, "creation is projected towards divinization, towards the holy wedding feast, towards unification with the Creator himself."""

Last year a three-year program of Eucharistic revival began with a focus at the diocesan level. This year we are asked to focus on a renewal at the parish level and next year it will culminate with a National Eucharistic Congress on July 17 to 21 in Indianapolis, IN. This might be a good time to inquire with your pastor about the possibility of a Eucharistic procession on the feast of the Body & Blood of Christ

(aka, Corpus Christi) on June 11, one month away; offer to organize the event, even if it's only around the parking lot! Your local Fourth Degree Assembly might not be able to provide an honor guard for multiple parishes on the same day, but your local council can provide logistics for your parish.

Or how about a holy hour of adoration? Some parishes have perpetual adoration- have you signed up for an hour? More parishes provide an hour (or two) at a regular time & day. Have you checked to see if you can work it into your schedule? Even if that doesn't work, surely there is some day/time when you could stop by and pay Jesus a visit.

My local dean is fond of saying, "If it isn't happening in the parish, it isn't happening in the diocese." I'd like to take it one step lower: "If it isn't happening in the lives of the parishioners, it isn't happening in the parish." Stepping into the breach begins with each one of us. A king of Sparta was fond of bragging about the impenetrable walls of his city, famous for the valor of its citizen soldiers. (Ever hear of Thermopylae?) A visitor came and could see no walls: "Where are the walls of which I have heard you brag?" The king responded by waving his hand at the citizens around him: "Here they are. In Sparta, every man is a brick."

The first Council in Kentucky was Council 390 and was chartered on December 7, 1898. The Council currently called 390 is not the same Council. It died and got suspended. Why? Same reason all Councils die – members got old, didn't recruit new blood, and lost leadership. We have a few councils in the state that are in the same boat right now. DON'T LET YOUR COUNCIL DIE! Don't cost your pastor the services of his council. Don't deny the other men of your parish the chance to grow in their faith through their good works. Don't deny the men of your parish access the tools they need to protect and grow the faith of their families.

How do you do that? It's so simple – just ask somebody. Let them know about your council's programs. Let them see your enthusiasm. Be prepared for rejection but keep trying!

There's still time to make sure your councils qualify for the Star Council award. District Deputies should be helping you make sure you meet the requirements.

And it's time to start planning for next year, starting with election of new officers by June 15th.

Recruit! and Retain! (or else ...)

You can't make Star Council if you don't make your new member quota, which was lowered this year to make it more easily attainable.

No councils came off the "Councils Which Have Not Recorded Any YTD New Membership", so we still have 20 active Councils which haven't recruited a new member this fraternal year.

for getting off the "Councils not yet recruiting a new member" list!
However, we still have 20 of our councils that still haven't recruited a new member. 20
councils are at risk of dying off. If you don't recruit, the council will not last.
Ask them, they will join. If you don't ask them, they won't join.

If each Knight asks 4 men a year to join the Order, and only one of them says yes, you'll still double the size of your council. If you don't ask, you don't grow!

Knights of Columbus will notify members of an email to be sent from the new Praesidium Academy on Tuesday, May 9th. The Praesidium Academy email will have instructions on how to log into the new platform and create a password. The Knights of Columbus is giving this advance notice to assure our members that these emails are authentic and NOT scams. Members who follow the instructions from Praesidium Academy will ensure their access the next time they are assigned safe environment training and screening.

Kentucky's Safe Environment Training" is at 34 councils are fully Compliant. Many Councils have just one more Brother to be Compliant. If you need help, please call me or e-mail me.

We need to achieve our "Safe Environment Training" goals, which is 36 councils. This means, Grand Knight, Program Director, Family Director, and Community Director need to complete the training. If you have completed this training in the last three years, you are good to go. It is on line training and takes about an hour to complete. The Councils that sponsor youth events like Free Throw Competitions, Soccer Challenge, Keep Christ in Christmas Poster, eta. "Safe Environment Training" (SET) is a must. You must have at least two SET Knights at these events (one must have a background check). If you cannot meet this requirement, you should not conduct this event. The same requirement is for youth helping you in your events (Fish fries, pancake breakfast, chicken cooks).

We are closing in on our Fraternal Year, we have two months to recruit New Members and Families in our Kentucky Knights of Columbus order. STATE HISTORIAN BILLY HANCOCK



May 12, 1912 the 9th Annual Kentucky State Council opened for business in the club rooms of Frankfort Council 1483. The State Deputy was James C. Rogers of Lexington. One hundred and eleven years later the 120th Kentucky State Council will convene in Frankfort on May 20, 2023. State Deputy Thomas Johnson will chair the meeting.

Frankfort served as the host city for five State Conventions. In addition to

the two mentioned above the 18th, 101st, and 119th convened there. The 18th was on

May 10, 1921. James J. Donavon, Ludlow, was State Deputy. It is speculation on my part but it is possible the venue was the Capital Hotel which was built in 1917.

Eighty-three years later the 101st Convention again convened in Frankfort on May 15, 2004. Gary B. Berkemeier, Edgewood, was State Deputy.

The 119th Convention convened in Frankfort in 2022. For the second consecutive year the 120th Convention will be held there.
