#### **Hope Pregnancy Center**



## Northern KY Knights Fundraiser for Catholic Charities



The recovery will go on well beyond when the news crews covering the disaster leave.

A very serene moment hit me as I was checking into my hotel alongside two other State Deputies who had just came from the airport in Charlotte, North Carolina for a Southeast Regional State Deputy meeting the Friday afternoon Helene came through. We had all experienced flight delays to Charlotte because the airport was closed until 10am due to Helenes path. Not too many people knew the real extent of the flooding yet, but enough news was



known that something was not right in the mountains of Western North Carolina and Tennessee as well as a large swath of Florida and Georgia. There was a housekeeping staff person at the check in desk and she was looking at the 2 other State Deputies and myself wearing polo shirts with Knights of Columbus emblems. She asks what organization we were with (almost as if she knew but wasn't sure) and when we told her we were with the Knights of Columbus, she asked if we were there for the disaster that was unfolding.

That is when it struck me that the little bit, she knew about the Knights of Columbus was enough to know that Knights help in situations such as was occurring due to Helene.

It made me proud to be associated with an organization that is seen in many areas as "those guys that are always helping someone" This was to me, a testament to the Knights of Columbus in the North Carolina State Council.

My hope is that all members of the Knights of Columbus in Kentucky and across the world realize that we are all in this together and everyone has a chance to do their part whatever that part is. Why not start today.

## 2024 Kentucky State Council Black Friday Coats for Kids BOGO (Buy One Get One) Opportunity

The Kentucky State Council has qualified for the BOGO (Buy One Get One) free case, Black Friday Coats for Kids promotion! Based on the responses from local Councils, the State Council will purchase a total of 1668 coats equaling 139 cases and utilize the Supreme match for this order. This means each council that is participating will receive one case of coats for every one

they order. The total # of cases that will be distributed by KY Councils using the BOGO incentive will be 278 cases or 3,336 coats. The Supreme is allowing up to 5 locations to deliver across the Commonwealth...

Louisville area=1968 coats/164 cases,

Lexington area=528 coats/44 cases,

NKY area=648 coats/54 cases,

Hopkinsville area=48 coats/4 cases,

Beaver Dam/Morgantown area=144 coats/12 cases

Program Director Fred Meade will be working out the "Area" locations with the participating councils so if you have a place where the coats can be delivered, and the area councils can pick their coats up at the delivery location. Make sure you invite your District Deputy, State Officers and State Deputy to help promote your distribution events.

**Safe Environment Training** – The Grand Knight, Program Director, Community Director and Family Director for each Council is required to have completed the Safe Environment Training courses administered by "Praesidium" for the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus. There are 3 short courses to be taken via internet (hard copies are available if necessary). The Family and Community Directors also need to have background checks (no charge) thru the Supreme Council. Please look for email notifications from Praesidium in your "inbox" or "spam/junk" folders for assigned username and password to complete this important training. #### **Fishers of Men**

I hope someone from each council was able to watch the webinar on Fishers of Men, the new recruiting strategy from Supreme. The key opening phrase is "It starts with an invitation". A recent survey commissioned by Supreme found that of the 21 million Catholic men in the US who are not Knights, 7 million of them would be willing to join. They haven't because **nobody has asked them to....** 

33% of Knights say they have never asked men to join the Order. 37% say they have only done so once or twice a year.

Each of us knows someone at Church or a relative who isn't a Knight. Past Supreme Knight Carl Anderson put it well when he said, "we owe every Catholic man the opportunity to be a Knight of Columbus". I strongly encourage you to ask at least one man to become a Knight this year and help grow the Order and preserve the health of your Council.

#### I got a new Job!

Following up on that subject, State Deputy Luke Williams has asked (volunteered?) me to serve as State New Council Development Chair and Round Table Chair. General Agent Daniel Schacle has also offered the services of our Fraternal Agents to serve as NCD chairs for each diocese.

Luke has a goal of six new councils in his two-year term so we have a lot of work to do. Dwight Frank and I have identified two target parishes in Louisville, and I'll be working with the other FAs to get more in the queue.

Round Tables can be a powerful tool for growing your council, extending the scope of your good works, and potentially forming a new council. I'll be contacting all the GKs to see who has existing RTs and who might have candidates.

If each Knight asks 4 men a year to join the Order, and only one of them says yes, you'll still double the size of your council. If you don't ask, you don't grow!

Youth Protection required Directors or your Membership Director as that position also needs to be filled for the 365 to be complete. Please review your status and add those missing position assignments.





#### Knights of Columbus - Enhanced fraternal and member benefits

When Father McGivney founded our Order, a key part of his mission was to help Catholic families attain a secure financial future. In keeping with that mission, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly recently announced updates to our member benefits.

Whether or not you are an insured Knight of Columbus, you are entitled to the **Member/ Spouse Fraternal Benefit**. This is an accidental death benefit varies from \$1,500-\$5,000, depending on your age, whether you are insured and how long you've been a member.

The other updates I'd like to summarize apply to insured members.

<u>Family Fraternal Benefit</u>: It's guaranteed-issue insurance up to \$10,000 to any child under age 18, regardless of physical or intellectual disabilities. This also includes an automatic \$5,000 death benefit for children who die before age 61 days, including stillbirths from at least 20 weeks after conception.

**Orphan Fraternal Benefit:** This benefit provides \$500 monthly to a member's child who has lost both parents, up to age 19. This benefit also includes up to \$5,000 per year in college scholarships, with a maximum total of \$20,000, per eligible orphan.

<u>Widow Benefit</u>: This benefit offers surviving spouses of insured Knights the opportunity to purchase Knights of Columbus products, and she and her children are eligible for scholarships. We strive to bring Father McGivney's mission to life by offering you these valuable benefits. Knights of Columbus Field Agents, would like to sit down with you to walk you through the benefits available to your family.


