




88th Birthday

To all whom these presents shall come:

Whereas, The Knights of Columbus founded in 1882, began their charitable work to show love for their neighbor by assisting the sick, disabled, and needy: and

Whereas, in 1978, the Knights of Columbus began the Kentucky Association to offer financial assistance to organizations that offer services to and for the intellectually disabled: and

Whereas, through the Kentucky Association for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities, the Knights of Columbus host a camp each year for 50 disabled campers where they can experience fellowship, swimming, crafts, and other activities in a supervised environment while providing a respite for their families and caretakers; and

Whereas the Knights of Columbus are called to be our brothers keepers and to do so by serving the disabled;

Now, therefore, I, Andy Beshear, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky do hereby pay tribute to the Knights of Columbus for their hard work and dedication to assist with fundraising for the Kentucky Association for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities.










STATE DEPUTY LUKE WILLIAMS



Brother Knights of Columbus,

There is a famous Healthcare consultant that has said "We have learned that the reluctance to address low/sub-par performance keep an organization from being the best."

We have just completed our 4th month of the 2024-2025 fraternal year and our overall breakdown for Membership Growth is "Sluggish" at best.

In relation to our Membership Growth Strategic Plan goal, the KY Jurisdiction currently has councils in these 3 groups of performers. High, Medium and Low/subpar performing councils.

Our "High" performing Councils have already demonstrated a giant commitment to following the membership goal of the 2024-2025 KY Jurisdiction Strategic Plan that has been distributed. Congratulations to the 11 Councils who have already achieved 50% - 100% or better of their membership quota. You are above the scale for this point in the fraternal year. 6 of those councils are at 100% or better and have already achieved the Fr. McGivney Award. This also means they are one step closer to the Strategic Plan goal of obtaining Star Council status which demonstrates the highest commitment to making things better for their parish, community and the Knights of Columbus order. Please continue to invite as many catholic men as possible to join your council all the way up to June 30, 2025.

Congratulations also to the 33 "Middle" performing Councils who have recruited at least one new member up to 49% of their membership growth goal. Please reach out to your District Deputy, State Membership Director or any State Officer for any help developing your further membership growth plan for the rest of the fraternal year.

Currently, we have 55 "Low/subpar" performing councils in the membership growth goal that have not yet initiated a new member into their council. This does not mean that new member recruitment has not been done, it is "Sluggish". I am asking our District Deputies to help all councils set regular dates for Charity, Unity and Fraternity (CUF) exemplifications and advertise to all councils in the area. It will be the Councils task to advertise these exemplifications in the parishes they serve. Please make sure to invite everyone, especially families.

I am asking our District Deputies to reach out specifically to these 55 councils and provide any assistance with membership performance steps as well as let them know our State Membership Director or any State Officer will also be available to help with any challenges a council may want to discuss.

In review, the 2024-2025 Strategic Plan has 4 goals for the KY Jurisdiction that we are working to achieve.

- +Membership Growth
- +COR initiative expansion in our parishes.
- +Partnership with our General and Field Agents of the Knights of Columbus Insurance program
- +Star Council Status achievement

The membership Growth goal for the first 4 months is "Sluggish" and I challenge all 99 KY Jurisdiction Councils to be at least 60% or better of your membership growth goal by December 31, 2024.

The councils in the Kentucky Jurisdiction have a strong history of success with strategic plan goals in the past and this year is shaping up to be a "Sluggish" year with council programs that

help our parishes and communities. I encourage and ask councils to step up your game and let's get to work on reaching our goals.

We are all committed to work together and help develop councils from the officers to every new member with training and answers so that all can achieve the distinguished goal which is the "Star Council" status.

I and the KY State Council thank all who have the Right Stuff and who step up and bring all of us with them towards the plan goals every year. I challenge those who for whatever the reason think they do not have the Right Stuff, to reach out to your District Deputy, or myself, and we will find out specific steps to improvement on the way to achieving this year's Strategic Plan goals. For membership growth, the first step is to ask someone to join the Knights of Columbus.

We have a responsibility, especially in the 4th degree, to participate in elections and preserve the integrity of the ballot. Look up the candidates and check their performance record, some will have been asked about their pro life stance but not all. Try to know the candidate before you arrive so you can help get the best representatives in office.

For those who have turned in their Form 365 (Service Program Personnel Report), Thank You. Please watch for the invitation from Praesidium Academy to meet the Safe Environment Training for those who need to complete this training. If you have completed this training in the last 2 years, the training is good for three years.

Reports as of today still show 38 councils not submitting their 365 successfully. This can result from either not submitting at all, or not filling in one of the required positions. These could be Youth Protection required Directors or your Membership Director as that position also needs to be filled for the 365 to be complete. Please review your status and add those missing position assignments.


We need to achieve our "Safe Environment Training" goals. This means, Grand Knight, Program Director, Family Director, and Community Director need to complete the training. If you have completed this training in the last three years, you are good to go. It is on line training and takes about an hour to complete. The Councils that sponsor youth events like Free Throw Competitions, Soccer Challenge, Keep Christ in Christmas Poster, eta. "Safe Environment Training" (SET) is a must. You must have at least two SET Knights at these events (one must have a background check). If you cannot meet this requirement, you should not conduct this event. The same requirement is for youth helping you in your events (Fish fries, pancake breakfast, chicken cooks).






Father Roy E. Dentinger AKA Father D

Kentucky Knights of Columbus State Chaplain Father Roy celebrated Detinger his 50th anniversary of his ordination into the priesthood June 10 at his home parish of St. Francis Assisi in Louisville. The 5:30 p.m. mass was celebrated to packed house.

reception followed in the hall where parish State outgoing Charles Deputy Jones "Squack" "D" Fr. presented with a custom made stole, decorated with Knights of Columbus emblem.

Fr. Detinger was ordained on June 3, 1950 at the Cathedral of the Assumption in Louisville by the late Archbishop John A. Floersh.

Father was baptized at St. James in Louisville, but his hometown parish is St. Francis of Assisi where he attended school and celebrated his first mass as a priest.

Fr. Detinger's laid back life has included being a teacher at three high schools; working in the chancery office for 14 years; pastor of three parishes; contact chaplain at Fort Know, off and on since 1952; and serving as the state chaplain for the Kentucky KCs since 1998.

He began serving the state council under the leadership of Jones when Jones became the state deputy and will continue his role when new State Deputy Gene Roberts takes office.

Fr. "D" is always there for us and we thank God we found a man like him to be part of this grand organization.

Thank you and God's blessing for all you do, Fr. Detinger! And Father, a big red ribbon to you because we are very proud of you.

Father D was a Knight for 39 years beginning his tenure in 1976. He served as Chaplain for the Father Diemert Council 3379, Vine Grove for a number of years. State Deputy Charles "Squack" Jones asked Father D to serve as State Chaplain beginning in 1998. Thus, the beginning of a long and distinguished period of service as State Chaplain. Having served from 1998-2002 and then again from 2006-2013. This is a testament to six State Deputies that were smart enough to hold on to him.

This extract from his biography only tells a portion of the Father D story. The Knights of Columbus have a motto "in Service to one, in Service to all. Father D so exemplified that motto that the Kentucky Knights named their lifetime Service Award "the Dentinger Lifetime Service Award". The Award was instituted in 2012 and Father D was the first recipient. His biography is testament to his worthiness of the award. While service to others was a major aspect of the man it was his ability to tell stories, his kindness and his humility that endeared him to his 11,000 brother Kentucky Knights. Father D was a skilled homilist and raconteur his humor was always close to the surface and almost always had a lesson behind it.


Our oldest numbered Council 390, Louisville, is named for Father D.
