2025 KofC Mexican Martyrs Relics in Kentucky – April 5 – April 11!



Kentucky is honored to receive the KofC Mexican Martyrs "Reliquary" that contains relics of 6 members of the Knights of Columbus who were martyred during the persecution of Catholics in Mexico from 1926-1929. The Reliquary seeks to make known in the United States the testimony of these Knights of Columbus priest martyrs and all those who sacrificed their lives for their faith during the time of religious persecution in Mexico. In 2000, 25 Mexican martyrs were canonized by Pope John Paul II. Six were members of the Knights of Columbus. The tour will be from April 5, 2025 till April 11, 2025. THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS CELEBRATE 125TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOURTH DEGREE

Historic Celebration Held at Saint Patrick's Cathedral in New York City

In a momentous event marked by tradition, reverence, and community, the Knights of Columbus celebrated the 125th anniversary of the Fourth Degree on Saturday, February 22, 2025. The historic walls of America's parish church, Saint Patrick's Cathedral in New York City, stood witness to this grand celebration, which featured the first presentation of the New Fourth Degree Exemplification.

The atmosphere was charged with excitement and pride as families, friends, and members of the Knights of Columbus gathered to witness over 650 candidates being inducted into the Patriotic Degree. This milestone event highlighted the enduring legacy and commitment of the Knights of Columbus to the principles of patriotism, charity, unity, and fraternity.

The New Fourth Degree Exemplification

The introduction of the New Fourth Degree Exemplification was a significant moment for the Knights of Columbus, particularly for the Fr. Edward F. Sorin Province. District Master of the Fourth Degree Patrick Gavin utilized the new ritual to initiate 104 candidates into the Patriotic Degree. This Province, which encompasses Indiana, Kentucky, and West Virginia, has long been a stronghold of the Knights of Columbus, and the new exemplification was met with enthusiasm and reverence.

In attendance were notable figures within the organization, including the Supreme Master, the Province Vice Supreme Master, and Province District Masters Cameron Peck and Paul Niedbalski. The presence of Tim Gahlinger, Secretary to the Master, Mike Kuchenbrod, District Warden, and Gary Dykhuis and Joe Carter, both Former District Masters of Kentucky, added to the significance of the event to the State of Kentucky.

A Nod to Tradition

During past ceremonies, many Sir Knights who had experienced the "Old" Exemplification expressed a sense of nostalgia and pride. They reminisced about the earlier ceremonies and shared their wish that their families could have attended those solemn occasions to hear the narration of Catholic history in the United States.

The new exemplification, while somewhat shorter than its predecessor, retains the core lessons and values that have been the hallmark of the Knights of Columbus. It is designed to be more inclusive, encouraging guests and families to attend and participate in the ceremony. This inclusivity ensures that the rich heritage and teachings of the Knights are shared with a wider audience, preserving their legacy for future generations.

In Conclusion



The Lenten Season/Easter is coming



- Now is the time to be <u>Inspired</u> to finish the Councils progress toward earning the <u>Star</u> <u>Council Award</u> designation.
- I am thankful for any Brothers who have at least tried to "Invite Every Catholic Man in Kentucky" to become a Knight of Columbus member as I have asked this fraternal year.
- I commend those Councils in KY that did their best to get to the 75% or better of your membership growth goal by March 31, 2025.





- I am encouraged by all KY councils or districts who have or are going to hold a Knights of Columbus Parish Outreach Drive in memory of Our Founder – Fr. Michael McGivney between now and June 30, 2025.
- I appreciate the increase in Charity, Unity, and Fraternity (CUF) exemplifications during the month of March. Please keep the progress going forward.
- The KY Jurisdiction has rolled out a new method for our Parish Outreach Drives. This past month, materials for a "Proof of Concept" Grey Packet process has been distributed to councils who are willing to try the process. This process has simple instructions on how to conduct a Parish Outreach Drive using a pulpit announcement, a "grey card" for online registration information and 4 KofC pamphlets. Results have been successful in getting more help to our Parishes and Priests from Catholic Men over the age of 18. Hint: the key is that when a new Catholic man is registered, we remind them that they will need to respond "Yes" when they receive an email from Supreme confirming they signed up online. Stay tuned as we will be reporting results at the State Convention.

Family/Chaplain/Knight/Service Program Awards

I am thankful to those councils in Kentucky who sent in submissions to be considered for the KY State Awards. The Awards Committee met on March 22nd and chose the Kentucky State Council winners. Each State Winner submission was sent to Supreme to be considered as Knights of Columbus International Program awards as well as for the International Family of the Year award and the Blessed Michael McGivney Medal. The KY State Winners Grand Knights were contacted and asked to have themselves or representatives of their councils present at the May 3, 2025 KY State Convention Banquet to receive their State Award. Congratulations to those councils, Chaplains and individuals who have been chosen for one of the State Awards. I am looking forward to presenting the award in person to the winners.

The Columbian Award shows anyone interested in joining your Council what you guys do. I advise the council program director or someone else that keeps track of the council programs, fill out an SP-7 and send to State Program Director Fred Meade (<u>fsmeade@fuse.net</u>) so he can review and make suggestions so there is a better chance the Supreme Office accepts the submission on the first try. Do it now while there is still time to submit again if necessary. You are allowed to include activities that "will be completed" between now and June 30th on the form. KofC Fraternal Benefits

I personally ask you to contact a Brother KofC Field Agent to review your plan to ensure that your family is taken care of if something happens to you.

Those councils that would like to have a Fraternal Benefit Event (FBE) in their District, Contact a KofC Field Agent in your area. Ask your agent if your council or district can "host" a FBE where the agent can use his prepared and approved presentations that promote member benefits and engagement. As always, remember to promote the good work our Knights of Columbus Insurance Agents do for all of us and our families as members.



STATE CHAPLAIN FR. JOHN LIST



"Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O Death, is your sting." (1 Corinthians 15:54-55)

Pope Francis couched his Lenten reflection this year against the backdrop of the Jubilee Year. If he had known at the time he was composing his Lenten reflection how close during Lent he would come to shaking off "this mortal coil", he might have drawn more directly from the citation above, which he refers to in the opening paragraph. However, he went beyond the obvious to the sublime, expanding his horizons, so to speak.

He begins by drawing on the Jubilee motto, "Pilgrims of Hope", to remind us that our life is a journey of conversion, foreshadowed by Israel's sojourn in the desert and echoed today by "our brothers and sisters who in our own day are fleeing situations of misery and violence in search of a better life for themselves and their families." The judgement parable of Matthew 25 makes me shudder to think about how our nation may be held to account for its current policies, but Pope Francis' application raises questions on a more personal level: "Am I really on a journey, or am I standing still, not moving, either immobilized by fear and helplessness or reluctant to move out of my comfort zone? Am I seeking ways to leave behind the occasions of sin and situations that degrade my dignity?" He suggests a novel examination of conscience, one of empathy with the experience of "some migrant or foreigner", to remind us as St. Peter says in his second letter that, as members of God's people, we "are strangers and in exile" (2 Peter 2:11).

Secondly, Pope Francis points out the communal dimension of the journey. Contrary to the preferred American myth of the lone wolf, "the Church is called to walk together, to be synodal... The Holy Spirit impels us not to remain self-absorbed, but to leave ourselves behind and keep walking towards God and our brothers and sisters." It is only pride that clings to the illusion that

one can only be secure when counting on oneself. The surrender of the Cross is precisely to die to self.

Finally, he turns to the other component of the Jubilee motto, that which sustains us for the journey, hope. Of course, this finds its final validation in the Resurrection, but like a precious metal it is purified by the questions that the challenges of life cause to rise within: "Am I convinced that the Lord forgives my sins? Or do I act as though I can save myself? Do I long for salvation and call upon God's help to attain it? Do I concretely experience the hope that enables me to interpret the events of history and inspires in me a commitment to justice and fraternity, to care for our common home and in such a way that no one feels excluded?"

May the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus be for you an impetus to take up the journey of conversion, that you may be a source of ever-new hope for your family and your brother Knights.

I'd like to wish everyone a Happy & Blessed Easter! Easter is late this year with Palm Sunday being on April 13th, Good Friday on April 18th and Easter Sunday on April 20th. You can bet that churches will be packed on Easter Sunday, but what about Palm Sunday & Good Friday... maybe not as much, and that's a shame. Palm Sunday celebrates Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem amongst the cheers & joy of the people and then five days later we are humbled and saddened by the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ on Good Friday. 
Upcoming Council Elections:

Have a Blessed Easter! There is still time to plan a "stations of the cross" or run the "Good Friday Family Promotion", and of course plan to reach out to the men in your OCIA programs as they graduate to Practical Catholic status and become eligible to join your council.

Holy hours such as saying a rosary or engaging in the Stages of the Cross event are just two ways to serve the faithful and get a step closer to your Star Council Award.

Council Elections are coming up!

Your council should form a nomination committee and consider who will be your officers for the next fraternal year. Don't wait till the election to speak to a capable brother knight about stepping up and taking an officer role.

Council Forms

You should have submitted most of your forms for this Fraternal year, and yet some councils still have forms missing at this point. GK and FS, as well as others, have access in the supreme portal – check there to make sure none of your forms show as missing. For your director positions there are some that are required for Youth Protection but others such as Membership Director must also be filled or Supreme will report your council as having not reported your 365. There is still time to submit those missing forms, let's get them in.

We have 26 councils not submitting the Fraternal Survey, 25 have not submitted the 365 (needed for SET compliance), and 3 without their 185 submitted. Not all positions have to be

submitted with the officer and director forms, but some are required (Safe Environment Directors and Membership Director).

We need to achieve our "**Safe Environment Training**" goals. This means, Grand Knight, Program Director, Family Director, and Community Director need to complete the training. If you have completed this training in the last three years, you are good to go. It is on line training and takes about an hour to complete. Don't let this be a stumbling block to achieving Star Council or a possible opening to liability should some adverse event occur during a council program, assist your members and get fully Safe Environment trained.







Brother Knights also carried a banner promoting the Annual Bluegrass on the Brashear event in western Kentucky.





Members who have attained the actual age of 65 years and who have been members of the Order for 25 consecutive years shall be designated as Honorary members; they shall be exempt from general fund charges except payment of \$10 per annum which shall include state and Supreme Council per capita charges and levies. Members who have attained the actual age of 70 years and who have been members of the Order for 25 consecutive years and those who have been members of the Order for 25 consecutive years and those who have been members of the Order for 50 consecutive years, regardless of age, shall be designated as Honorary Life members; they shall be exempt from further payment of dues, per capita charges and assessments.

When a member has attained either the actual age of 65 or 70 and has been a member 25 consecutive years or who has been a member for 50 years, regardless of age, he is entitled to have this distinction conferred regardless of whether he continues to pay dues or takes advantage of the reduction or exemption. If the member has been a member for 25 consecutive years and has reached age 70 or has been a member for 50 years, regardless of age, the only change in the following ceremonial is to substitute the words "Honorary Life Member" for "Honorary Member" wherever the latter appears.

The honor may be conferred upon one individual member or in groups of two or more. If a group, change singular to plural where necessary. The following items should be obtained by the financial secretary prior to the ceremony. Honorary member (#1457) and Honorary Life member

(#1458) certificates are available at no charge from the Supreme Council Supply Department. Honorary member (#PG-109) and Honorary Life member (#PG-11 0) lapel pins are available for purchase through the Supreme Council Supply Department. Careful preparations for this solemn ceremony should be made and every care taken to make its impressions lasting. Each officer should be prepared to deliver his part without notes or prompting. For an officer to read his part is strictly forbidden.

This ceremony may be conducted with the presence of the family and other guests or in private under "The Good of the Order." Council officers should be neatly dressed for this ceremony.

HONORARY (HONORARY LIFE) MEMBERSHIP CEREMONIAL

G.K. - Our laws provide for conferring a degree of honor upon any member of this council who by reason of age and years of service is worthy of that distinction. The Worthy D.G.K. will announce the name(s) of our brother(s) to be so honored today (or tonight).

D.G.K. - Worthy G.K., the Worthy F.S. has certified to me the name(s) of Brother(s) as meriting this honor. (Asks brother(s) so to be honored to step forward.)

Chan. - Worthy G.K. and brothers, the Knights of Columbus is a strong lay arm of the Church. In the solemn ceremony of initiation, you promised unswerving loyalty to her. You learned also the powerful lesson of unity; and unity, my brothers, means keeping ourselves together in carrying out the high aims and purposes of our Order. When receiving Knightly honors in this Order, you were pronounced the hope of Church and State. Be you ever, therefore, valiant sons of Holy Church and upright and loyal citizens of the State.

Our Holy Father, the Vicar of Christ on earth, looks with gracious favor upon this our Order and asks our valor and aid in subduing the forces of error and irreligion that attack the Citadel of Christ.

The Order has acquired fame and honor throughout the land for its community service work, its works on behalf of the Church, its pro-life work, its work with Catholic education, its work to support and foster religious vocations, its involvement with the Vatican, its fraternity, charity and benevolences.

How important it is, therefore, that each member of this council should continue steadfast in his fidelity to the Order. The brother who would surrender or abandon his membership is like unto the soldier who fails his country in the time of stress and struggle - our Order becomes like unto the cable whose strands become bruised or broken.

Let us be ever mindful, therefore, brothers, to maintain our membership in the Order to the end that our Knightly forces be not weakened or diminished in the ever impending battle for God and for truth and that we be better enabled to promote and carry on our humanitarian work.

And so, I say, Worthy G.K., that the purpose of this ceremony is to seek out and reward the persistent and faithful members of this council; and from this station I pronounce the brother(s) designated by the Worthy D.G.K. truly deserving of the honor you are about to confer.

(One Rap)

G.K. - (Addressing the brother[s]) Brother(s), --------, theSupreme Council of our Order has empowered ------- Council No.------ to confer upon you the title of Honorary Member (Honorary Life Member) and this decoration of honor and loyalty. You have merited this distinction because you have kept yourself in good standing in the Order for (announce the actual number of years applicable) and with self-sacrifice and unselfishness have aided the Order in the accomplishment of its noble aims. Whether as a humble member in the ranks or as one honored by your brothers with place or position in this society, your earnestness and zeal have been noted by your superior officers as well as by your brothers of the council. The Order needs such men, men of character, men of principle - stalwart Catholic men. By virtue, therefore, of the authority conferred upon me by the supreme council of the Order, I pronounce you an Honorary (Honorary Life) Member of the Knights of Columbus - and by like authority I bestow upon you this Honorary Member (Honorary Life Member) travel card and lapel pin, a mark of merit and distinction among your brother knights. It symbolizes your loyalty, devotion and obedience to the principles of our honored Order.



Although the cards are not available, a member should be recognized when he reaches this point in his tenure as a Knight. The following items are available from Supreme Supply.




