In October 2020, during **Respect Life Month**, Council 11470 began a quarterly collection drive in support of the **Not Alone Pregnancy Center**. What started as a small initiative has now reached an incredible milestone.

This month marks our 5th Anniversary, and after 21 collections I'm pleased to share that our council has collected a total of \$22,012 in cash/check over this period including \$1,459 this month alone.

The Knights at St Edward Council 15841 in Louisville have collected food supplies from local grocery stores beginning with the pandemic in 2020, and donating them to local food pantries and shelters throughout Louisville.

One such pantry, is located at the Calvary Episcopal Church, directed by Margaret Dickinson, who is a winner of a prestigious 2025 Bell award for her outreach food program to the poor in Central Louisville.

She emphasizes that "all of our 74 volunteers and contributing organizations are responsible and deserve the credit- NOT ME!

WLKY will be filming our food operations this week, in preparation for a documentary that will air on channel 32 on October 18 at 8pm. Best news is that our food pantry gets a \$500 prize! The overwhelming stats since Covid onset 3/16/20 are now 111,111 bags of food and toiletries serving 129,075 people. WOW for sure! Our village is amazing!"

# **CONSTITUTION DAY**


On Wednesday September 17th Assembly 2753 celebrated Constitution Day with the seventh and eighth grade students from Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic School.

We had the Honorable Judge John Atkins, and Magistrate Russ Guffy as featured speakers. Judge Atkins spoke about the three branches of government with particular attention paid to the judicial branch. Magistrate Guffy spoke about the difference between the Declaration of Independence, Constitution, and the Bill of Rights. He stressed the importance that the Constitution is not and was never perfect. He explained that is why we have twenty-seven amendments, to cover things that were not thought of in years passed. He mentioned the first amendment guarantees free speech, the right to assemble, and religious freedom. He also discussed the amendments abolishing slavery, and giving women the right to vote. Magistrate Guffey kept the students engaged and participating in the discussion, they really seemed to enjoy his presentation.

# Miracles at the Table - September 10, 2025

St. Michael the Archangel Council 18284 in Fort Mitchell hosted Fr. Leo Patalinghug for "Miracles at the Table" dinner, a discussion built around Father Leo's concept of the "Theology of Food." 400 enthusiastic attendees gathered to explore the profound connection between faith, food, and family. The engagement was an inspiring talk and cooking demonstration delivered by the charismatic Priest, author, and award winning-Chef, who captivated the audience with his humor and wisdom.

As Father Leo put it, the dinner table is "more than just where we eat. It's where God feeds our hearts, our relationships and our faith".

Fr. Leo challenged attendees to consider the art of "Plating Grace"—the opposite of the devil's "art of plating," which makes bad things look good. Our mission is to transform ourselves into "culinarian spiritual sommeliers" discerning what nourishes us and what doesn't, ultimately making grace attractive and visible for our families to consume. This central



idea came alive during his lively cooking demonstration of Rigatoni Alla Norcina, where every ingredient served as a metaphor for life and faith.

### Key Takeaways: Why the Family Meal is Non-Negotiable

One of the most impactful takeaways from the evening was the scientific and spiritual case for making the family meal a priority. Father Leo shared powerful data, citing a study that identifies a **regular family meal** as the number one factor in improving a teenager's testing scores and reducing risks such as teen drug addiction, pregnancy, and suicide. This isn't about perfection; it's about priority. To achieve this, Father Leo gave three actionable steps:

- **1.Master the Schedule:** We must "master our schedule or our schedules master us". Instead of letting extracurriculars dictate the calendar, decide when your family will eat together first. Even two to three planned meals a month can make a huge difference.
- **2.Make Good Food:** Good food is essential because, as he comically noted, a full mouth is a quiet mouth, allowing parents to talk to their kids.
- **3.Get Everyone Involved:** Involve the whole family in every step, from shopping to cleanup. This teaches the essential "gift of serving and therefore the gift of loving".



### **Peace**




# Brothers,

The local District Deputy, State Membership Director Tom O'Hagan or I will send a list that is separated by Parish or city of those who should be contacted. The first step is to schedule and set up a CUF exemplification. The next step is to ask these men along with all other catholic men over 18 of your Parish to attend this exemplification with their families. I also recommend that your District has at least one CUF a month. Let your District Deputy know when, where and what time scheduled CUF's are made. Invite other councils to attend. I would like to put this in perspective; this amount is larger than our largest local Council that now supports 2 parishes. Please don't make these members wait any longer to enjoy the full benefits of being a Knights of Columbus Brother to help his Parish, community and family.





# Fraternal Year 2025-26 Membership Growth Incentives

## Quick Start – July 1st thru September 30th (First Quarter)

- #1 Every council that has submitted a completed Form 185, Form 365, a minimum of one Fraternal Benefit Event (FBE), Safe Environment Training (SET) compliant, a minimum of one Parish Outreach Drive (POD) (scorecard submitted to SD and MD), and add at least 50% of their yearly membership goal by the end of the day on 9/30, will receive \$50
  - Councils that have qualified 7847
